GBEW Network Community Group - Assistant Leader

ROLE CONTEXT: The Girls' Brigade is a Christian organisation whose aim is 'To help girls to become followers of the Lord Jesus Christ and through self-control, reverence and a sense of responsibility to find true enrichment of life.'

Assistant Leaders are required to be in sympathy with our aims and values whilst carrying out their duties.

ROLE TITLE: ASSISTANT LEADER

TRAINING:

The following **n:fluence 18+** training modules **must** be completed by those wishing to be appointed as an Assistant Leader.

- Mission: God's Mission = Our Mission
- Young people: relevant module for age group(s) to be working with
- Relationships: Developing Relationships
- Pastoral Care: Safeguarding
- Pastoral Care: Positive Behaviour Management

Additional n:fluence 18+ training modules may be undertaken at the discretion of the Team Leader.

RESPONSIBLE TO: Team Leader/Leaders

RESPONSIBLE FOR: Supporting group leaders within the local GB Community Group

Role of Assistant Leader: To support and work alongside leaders in providing weekly group activities, trips and events including residentials and sleepovers for (primarily) girls and young women.

Role description

The role will include, but not be limited to,:

- Ability to support and assist group Leaders and Team Leader in leading GB group activities
- Leading a specific activity within their area of expertise/skill set
- Provides support to Team Leader and Leaders
- Work together as part of a team
- To support the supervision of weekly group activities, events and outings
- Follow the Code of Conduct for Volunteers and operate within the policies as set out within Girls' Brigade Ministries' *Life to the Full*.

Role requirements

Assistant Leaders should:

- Complete the required **n:fluence 18+** training modules as detailed above
- Have an up-to-date DBS, as specified by GBEW
- Complete the Volunteer Registration Form and send it to the GB Support Centre.

Please note: Some volunteers may need to be a church member if stipulated by the church your GB group belongs to.
